### Developing tasks and materials for study skills in **English Literary form**

Study skills are approaches applied to learning. They are critical to success in school, considered essential for acquiring good grades and useful for learning throughout life. It is an array of skills that tackles the process of organizing and taking in new information, retaining information and expressing their understanding. Any skill which boosts a person's ability to study, retain and recall (gathering, storing, retrieving) information which assists in academic success can be termed as a study skill.

Criterias for developing task and materials for study skill in literary form: 1. A clear purpose and learning objective (based on a literary

- skill or ability/ what you want learners to achieve). The objective should be specific and achievable.
- 2. Materials or tasks should be set in its difficulty and understanding level (physical age, mental age)
- 3. Tasks and materials should be based on learners' interest (based on the majority's preference since it will be difficult to cater to each individual). Varieties of tasks and materials can be given to accommodate everyone's
- 4. It should be culturally and socially sound, sensitive to different groups, ethnics and cultures.
- Instructions given for the tasks and materials should be complete and clear. The language used to give the directions should be simple and age appropriate.
- 6. There should be a plan for assessing the objective and a mechanism for providing feedback to Students (learning criteria, learning outcome and assessment criteria)

Tasks and materials should not be the center of the lesson or the goal of the lesson. It should be used as a supplement to the actual learning in the classroom.
